Edith C. Hamm fonds

The daughter of James Harris and Elba Rebecca “Elby” (Wentzell) Hamm, Edith Celestial Hamm was born in 1910 at Mahone Bay, where her father worked as a blacksmith. Known as “Chook” or “Chookie,” Edith Hamm operated a barbershop in Mahone Bay for many decades. She died at Lunenburg in 1993 and is buried in Mahone Bay.

Fonds consists of photographs documenting the early life of Edith Hamm, as well as the lives of other members of the Hamm family and family friends, primarily in the Mahone Bay area.

The records were acquired by the Mahone Bay Museum following the death of Edith Hamm, forming part of the museum’s archival backlog.
