Fonds Description: MBMS-63 Murray P. Ernst fonds

Murray Paul Ernst, the son of Willis Anthony Ernst and Bertha Blanche Mills, was born at Mahone Bay in 1899. A grandson of the noted merchant and shipbuilder Abraham Ernst, he married Helen Bell Richardson in 1939. Ernst, who apparently worked for a time at the Ernst store and shipyard in Mahone Bay, died at Lunenburg in 1993 and is buried in Park Cemetery in Mahone Bay.

The fonds consists of a view of the Ernst Shipyard in Mahone Bay as well as photographic portraits (by Lewis A. Hirtle of Lunenburg) of Ernst's grandparents, Abraham (1849-1911) and Rachel (Graves) Ernst (1854-?). The latter was the daughter of Anthony Graves, who figured prominently in the history of the treasure hunt on Oak Island.

The photographs, which were originally donated by Murray P. Ernst prior to his death in 1993, were found in the museum's backlog and processed in 2019 (Accession Nos. 2019.1.10A - 2019.1.10C).
